1. More Children Are Now Eligible for Express Enrollment:

The state is broadening the requirements for Express Enrollment (EE) for children to allow more children to enroll. Effective April 1, 2009, children who meet the following criteria can temporarily enroll in BadgerCare Plus via EE and receive health care coverage under BadgerCare Plus while a full application is being processed by their local county or tribal agency:

- Children younger than age 1 whose family income is at or below 250 % of the FPL.
- Children ages 1 through 5 whose family income is at or below 185 % of the FPL.
- Children ages 6 through 18 whose family income is at or below 150 % of the FPL.

2. One Period of Temporary Enrollment Per Child Per Year:

Effective April 1, 2009, a child is allowed to have only one period of temporary enrollment in a 12-month period. Therefore, it is important for children to apply for full BadgerCare Plus coverage as soon as possible to avoid gaps in health care coverage. The period of temporary enrollment remains the same. Temporary enrollment will still run from the date of application to the end of the following month. However, if an application is submitted to a local county or tribal agency and enrollment in full BadgerCare Plus is denied, the temporary enrollment period ends on the same date BadgerCare Plus enrollment is denied. If an application submitted to the local county or tribal agency is not processed before the end of the second month, the local agency will extend the EE enrollment period by one month.

3. Temporary Express Enrollment Cards:

The eligibility period for Express Enrollment remains unchanged; people are still eligible until the last day of the month following the month in which they applied. Children and pregnant women who are temporarily enrolled in BadgerCare Plus via EE will receive a temporary card that is valid for 14 days. When the 14 days has expired, members will need to use the ForwardHealth identification card they receive in the mail for the duration of their express enrollment period. This identification card replaces the temporary card, usually within three business days after the EE application is submitted and approved. To ensure children and pregnant women receive needed services in a timely manner, providers should continue to accept the printed paper EE cards for children and either the printed paper EE card or the beige identification cards for pregnant women for the dates printed on the card. Providers may use Wisconsin's Enrollment Verification System to verify enrollment for dates after those printed on the card. Providers are encouraged to keep a photocopy of the card.

Senator Russ Feingold Listening Session - Rock County: Saturday, April 11, at

BadgerCare Plus allows individuals who meet a certain set of financial and non-financial criteria the ability to "backdate" their coverage. Instead of having their BC+ benefits start in the month they applied for coverage, backdated coverage for families below 150% of the Federal Poverty Level (FPL) can cover bills incurred in the three previous months plus the month the application date is filed. Individuals might not be aware that they can request backdated coverage, might not understand what backdated coverage means, or may not realize they have medical bills or pharmacy expenses prior to their application month. Luckily, a request for backdated coverage can be made at any time, and does not need to be made at the time of application for benefits. (See the BadgerCare Plus Eligibility Handbook, [Ch. 25.8.1: Backdated Eligibility](#).) NOTE: A pregnant woman is also eligible for backdated coverage, unless she would only be eligible for BC+ by meeting a deductible for any months prior to her application month.

If an individual has any medical bills in the month the application is filed or in the three previous months, they can simply call their medical provider, provide them with their Medicaid ID number, and ask that the provider bill BC+. In some instances, the individual may be eligible to receive a refund, up to the amount already paid to the provider.

EXAMPLE 1: Jim's household has an income under 150% FPL. Jim applied for coverage for the family in February, and all family members were found eligible. At the time of application, Jim did not request backdated coverage. He later received a bill from his son's physician for services provided in January. As long as Jim's household income was at or below 150% of the FPL for January, it is not too late for him to contact his Economic Support worker to request backdated coverage for that month. Once Jim requests backdated coverage, he can call his son's medical provider and ask that they bill BC+ for the January visit. Similarly, Jim can request backdated coverage for any bills in December and November, as long as his household income was below 150% of the FPL for the month(s) in which the service(s) were provided.

EXAMPLE 2: Joan, a pregnant woman, applied for BC+ on February 6, 2009, and was found eligible. At the time of application, Joan did not request backdated coverage. In June, Joan receives a bill in the mail for a doctor's appointment she had at the end of November 2008. It is not too late for Joan to ask her caseworker to backdate her eligibility through November. Since, she meets all non-financial and financial eligibility criteria in the three months prior to her application, her economic support worker certifies her for BC+ coverage for November, December, and January. Joan calls her doctor's office to ask them to bill BC+ instead of sending the bill to her.
