Renewing BadgerCare Plus

What You Need to Know

What is a BadgerCare Plus Renewal?

A renewal is the process during which all eligibility factors subject to change are reexamined. The process helps determine if the individual who had BadgerCare Plus in the prior year is still eligible to continue receiving benefits.

How Frequently Do You Need to Renew?

Renewals must be done on time! BadgerCare Plus recipients are required to renew their benefits every 12 months. Renewals can be done over the phone by calling an IM Consortium, or online if someone has an account on www.access.wi.gov. (See back for more info).

What if You Miss Your Renewal?

If a renewal isn't completed, the recipient's benefits will end.

Is There A Grace Period?

Yes! If a BadgerCare Plus recipient missed her renewal, she has 3 months to requests to renew benefits. The renewal will be processed as a "late renewal." This allows the member to submit any necessary verification items without having to start a new application. If she does not request a renewal within 3 months of her renewal month, she will have to start a new BadgerCare Plus Application.

When Do Benefits Start?

Typically the benefits will start in the month the renewal is completed, which means if she missed any months in between the renewal date and the late renewal, she may have a gap in coverage.

Can You Backdate Coverage to Fill the Gap?

Yes! You can request backdated coverage for the months of the gap BacgerCare
