BadgerCare? Yes!!

An important feature of BadgerCare Plus is backdated* eligibility for coverage. The back-date feature is your ticket to secure certain health coverage for treatments before your application approval. However, for certain medical services, drugs or equipment, Medicaid or BadgerCare Plus requires prior authorization (PA) or approval before services are eligible for reimbursement. If your medical services are in a back-date period and require a PA you are still eligible for coverage. Remember to ask your worker about retroactive eligibility for Medicaid.

Example: Sally applies for BadgerCare Plus on September 21, 2009. At that time, she requests to have her coverage backdated to the first day of the month, September 1, 2009. After Sally applies for coverage, but before she finds out about her eligibility for benefits, she has several medical appointments. Sally receives her ForwardHealth card in October and learns that she is retroactively eligible for BadgerCare Plus. Her benefits are active from September 1, 2009 onward. While Medicaid now covers most of her medical care from September, her benefits won't automatically cover certain appointments that require a Prior Authorization (PA).

Sally's medical provider must complete a *retroactive prior authorization* request. Sally's provider should have the PA request forms that include a section to describe the services provided. The provider must identify the specific services Sally received while she was eligible for benefits, and the actual date of each service. If Medicaid approves the PA, Sally will be covered beginning September 1, 2009--the date her BadgerCare Plus benefits began.

*Back-date periods for BadgerCare Plus may include the month of application and the three previous months if the family has a household income under 150% FPL for each of those months. For households with income over 150% FPL, BadgerCare Plus will only backdate to the first day of the month of application.

Ops Memo 10-11: Child Care in ACCESS and Approved Activity Code Change (released January 22)

New Policy: As of January 23, 2010, users of the ACCESS website will be to check their eligibilty and apply for child care services. They will also be able to report changes online, initiate annual reviews and submit Six Month Review Forms online. All verification and interview requirements remain unchanged.

Rationale: The ability to apply for child care services through ACCESS will improve program outreach and availability and strengthen its integrity.

Ops Memo 10-10: Expansion of Medicaid and BadgerCare Plus Eligibility for Non-Citizen Children and Pregnant Women (released January 25)

New Policy: Changes to the Oct. 1 lifting of the 5-year ban for benefits for non-citizens, to include certain populations classified as a non-immigrant status. This includes temporary resident status, temporary protective status, temporary religious or aid workers, non-citizens engaged to citizens entering the country to marry, permanent legal non-immigrants from Micronesia, the Marshall Islands, or Palau, and several other categories. Individuals under 21 who are institutionalized shall also be eligible.

Rationale: The expansion expands coverage to certain groups whose status may be more complicated than standard immigration situations.
